

PSA SUNSHINE COAST DEMONSTRATION AUGUST 2021 Tricia Taylor - Seascape

Tricia began the demonstration with a discussion on 'Pythagoras Harmonic Armature 'a design method which she applied to subject.



UNDERPAINTING:

Pastel Premier paper was used, Tricia chose to use a watercolour underpainting to put in the initial dark areas because if you use pastel for the darks and then put light pastel over the top you can create 'mud'. Marine Blue (Holbein) was the base colour for a good strong but transparent dark. Yellow was added to this to adjust colour. All the colours were premixed before starting. A sky mix, wave mix , a warmer mix for the top of the wave and a dark for the rocks, no white areas were left as these would be added later with pastel. Some orange was added to the darker rock colour. Tricia positioned the rock as a lead in to the top of wave (focal point) in the direction of the line in Image 1. At this stage of the painting, get in the BASIC SHAPES. More than 5 shapes are too many. The back wave on the left hand side is also angled to the top of the wave.



APPLYING PASTEL:

Start with the sky then the background sea (horizon line). When trying to make a straight line use the side of the pastel. The different tones make the straight line. For the background sea, make your strokes in the rhythm of the waves and the strokes become thicker as you come forward. Usually about 3 passes of colour are required for the background sea.

For the wave, four tones are needed. Remember that every step lighter in tone becomes greener and every step darker becomes bluer. Always keep strokes in the direction of the water. Start with the darks being careful not to fill the tooth. Look for areas where you wish to reserve the watercolour showing through and pick the same TONE of pastel to run into it. Make the wave transition slowly by glazing layer by layer.

When painting the rocks use cool colours in the shadow areas (warm light/cool shadow). At this stage don't let the 'math' (Pythagoras harmonic armature) rule your painting, just use it to confirm what you are doing. At least three tones are needed for the rocks and stroke in the direction of the planes. Don't overdo it as white water needs to go on top.

White water: Three tones are required once again. The air bubbles forming the foam give the white colour and reflected light from the water gives the green look. The light on the foam is warm sunlight. Start warmer in the light areas and use cooler colours in the shadows. Every time you change colour in the shadow areas; change tone. Dark purple to pink to warm white (3 tones) Or Violet to red-violet to apricot to lemon (4 tones). The number of tones depends on how strong the light is. The violets are deeper in tone in strong light. Glaze over these colours with colours used in the water, using the same tone to grey the vibrancy and increase the harmony as the water colour appears to be reflected back into the white water.

For the peaks of the waves push in hard with the point of a yellow one step down from warm white. The tonal work must be done before adding the white as this does the 'lifting'. The water in the flat area in front of the wave is reflecting the sky blues. Sky blues are also in the puddles on the rocks on the right hand side. A darker blue is needed for the puddles on the left hand side and the puddles on the left hand rocks.



This was a very informative demonstration from Tricia and we appreciated her sharing her knowledge with us. We extend our thanks to Tricia. Written by Annette Irvine

PSA BRISBANE DEMONSTRATION SEPTEMBER 2021 Tricia Reust - Pastel on Canvas

EXAMPLE WORKS

Tricia displayed several finished works using the pastel on canvas technique, including "PEAR" – pastel with water over collage on canvas.

"MORNING" – pastel and pastel pencil over collage on canvas.

"JABIRU" – giclee – showing several layers of white to build up light areas in the bird; cerulean wash in water and dry brushing with pastel.

"FREEWHEELING" - pastel over tissue on canvas using pastel with pencils.

"ORANGE HILLS" – AS soft squares ideal for contemporary approach – they do not dissolve in water.

WHY PASTEL ON CANVAS?

Tricia always loved drawing on canvas and loved to push colour around with water. Also, the finished works have a durable surface and do not require framing under glass, or any other framing if the edges of the canvas are painted, saving framing costs. It is also cheaper to use pastel on canvas (in the ways described below) than using oils on canvas.

PELICAN DEMONSTRATION

Prior to the demo, Art Spectrum (AS) clear pastel primer had been applied to the canvas in the areas where the pelicans would be drawn. The surface was allowed to dry. Tricia's photo reference is her own photo.



A blue/purple palette was chosen for the painting and so some orange/yellow pastel was placed to accentuate the pelicans as the focal point and as an area of counterbalance.

Applying the dark tones first, the pelicans were placed with a blue pastel pencil, the yellow area laid, and the lines of the water movement (and reflections) placed with various tones of blue and purple pastel. Tricia was looking for shape, not accuracy, at this stage and described the beautiful feel of the pastel moving across the canvas.



Water was applied with a scribbling motion with the pastel sticks worked into the wet. Any sizing on the canvas will prevent the full and solid spreading of colour. Areas of wet pastel not required can be lifted out with a paper towel.

Pastel sticks need to be continually wiped to keep them clean. The sticks can be used on the tip or on the edge.

Keeping the canvas flat, water was pushed into the pastel with a brush. The canvas was tilted upright, and drips encouraged to form, using more water on the brush in certain areas. Art Spectrum (AS) and Faber Castell products work well water except for the AS Soft Square pastels, which do no work with water. Rembrandt pastel have a higher wax content and are not effective.

The pelicans and reflections were tidied up with pastel pencil. After drying, the work was taken outside to apply a coat of spray varnish, not fixative.

The use of AS bright white exhibits some interesting properties. It may disappear with the first spray application, but further application of the pastel allows gradations of tone not possible with any other medium. The subtlety of the gradations allows the underpainting to participate more strongly in the work.


After the demo, Tricia completed the following steps at her studio :

Tidying up the drawing with pastel pencil; adding white and turquoise lines and shapes to the water with Art Spectrum Extra Soft squares; mixing white pastel with water on the palette to make a pastel "Paint", and

using a liner brush to splatter the yellow areas to further reinforce the original design (see close up below); signing (left hand corner in white) and varnishing.



HINTS

Economical good quality canvases available from Creative Art Canvasses at Eumundi. If the colour on the back of the canvas is ecru, then it is a real fabric and not an imitation.

Chroma Solvent Gloss Varnish is recommended. It will slightly darken some colours and not affect others.

AS square pastels are impervious to spray.

Can use leaves and other shapes as stencils. Print using charcoal and water mix.
