

- 2. Entries must be the original work of the entrant, which precludes works completed in workshops or under tutelage, and/or copied from any source other than that belonging to the entrant. Source material to be available if requested. Entries must have been completed in the last two years and must not have previously won an award with the PSA.
- 3. Maximum Size of finished painting: 550mm x 750mm (excluding frame)
- Maximum of 3 entries/member in different categories . Non-PSA Members maximum 1 entry. All PSA members must be financial by 31st August 2018.
- 5. Categories for 2018: People/Animals

Scapes Still Life.

All paintings can be traditional or contemporary in style.

Prizes in each category: 1^{st} \$1000 2^{nd} \$500 3^{rd} \$300.

- 14. All works are to be ready for display with hanging wire or cord and "D" rings firmly attached. Gallery specifics requires additional "D" hooks to be placed 75mm from the top of frame with the "D" facing upwards. This is essential.
- 15. All works will be seen by the judges, though all works may not be hung if available space is restricted. The judges' decisions are final.
- 16. All care will be taken in storing and hanging of art but no responsibility will be taken by the PSA, or those associated with the Breakfree Resort.
- 17. Exhibition will be held at Breakfree Resort Conference Room, Caloundra, Qld, Australia. Open daily and gold coin donation requested.
- 18. Receipt of works by hand at **Breakfree Resort Conference Room, 100 Bulcock Street, Caloundra** from 8.30am 10.30am Tuesday 11th September.
- 19. Post courier/freight works, to PSA Exhibition Coordinator Tricia Reust 168 King Street, Clontarf, Qld 4019 Australia.



It was also an extra special treat to have the Gallery opened for us to view the spectacular Art of Wool Travelling Exhibition as well as seeing our own work on display.

With blue skies and brilliant sunshine we started our week by visiting the Robert Channon Winery which overlooks a delightful panoramic view of a lake and the vineyard. Painting the trees there in their autumn shades and sampling the delicious cuisine at the Singing Lake Café completed the day.



Again with lovely weather the next day we drove in convoy to Dalmoak which is a property we have enjoyed visiting in the past. It has a splendid diversity of subjects to paint and we never fail to produce something spectacular each time. This time was no different.

Wednesday took us to a new venue i.e. 102yr old Waverley Forge and its lovely age-old house. They were a delight to paint. The new owner was very hospitable and welcomed us with a tour around the property and invited us back next year.



The next day we all drove to Tenterfield and although we didn't produce much art work, our cameras captured many trees draped in their autumn colours. We all met for a lovely lunch at Stannum House. This is a foremost architecturally and historically significant building in the district and was built in 1888 by John Holmes Reid. It is well worth a visit even just to view the interior décor alone.

Friday's weather was showery so after a couple of us had a talk with the Year 11 &12 Art students at the local high school enlightening them on the joys of plein air painting, some of us had a `yummy` lunch at a cute little ex church –now café. Then we set up a vase of flowers in the lounge at the Tourist Park and invited everyone to challenge their skills with a still life.

With glorious weather the next day a visit to Boireann Winery and Donnelly's castle was suggested. This proved very exciting for everyone as the autumn shades of the many maple trees were magnificent. We couldn't have asked for a better ending to our week.

Brisbane Demonstration Report April 2018 Colourful Skies

Anne Yang lives close to a lake near Cooroy, in the Sunshine Coast hinterland. Late in the afternoon the skies over the low land-forms are especially good to look at and paint.

Before the meeting, Anne did some quarter-sheet 'warm-ups' of the scene she planned to demonstrate to us in the evening using different coloured papers. We looked at 3 works:

- Clouds catching the golden, late afternoon light, painted on light, sand-coloured paper, which makes it harder to get to the darks See below
- The same scene on dark, terracotta paper, where Anne needed to push harder to catch the lights See below
- Soft clouds a little earlier in the afternoon, catching the pinks, on a medium tone paper (half-sheet).

The set of photos Anne used as reference were the same as the 2 quarter-sheet exercises. However she chose to paint on mid-tone, soft umber paper. The



sky needs to take up the majority of the painting, so the horizon is low, but often Anne finds the horizon creeps up. With more time, she would underpaint with hard pastels, but with the time constraint of the demonstration, she used softer pastels from the start. Her intention was to leave the paper colour showing through.

Where are the main shapes?

- Too many shapes will mean no point to the painting.
- Block in the distant shorelines and the foreground tree, but avoid the mid-vertical line to start or end your shapes.

• Clouds are fleeting, so it's not necessary to make them exactly like the photos.

What is the main focus?

• In this case it is the high point of the clouds, for the eye to travel to.

Where do you start?

- There's no rule. This time it's the sky.
- The sun is setting behind the viewer's right shoulder, so the blue of the sky is quite intense.
- The blue will grade down to the horizon, but without a perfect finish, to allow you to change your mind as the rest develops.

How do you paint the clouds?

- Note that there is a lighted side and a shadow side to the clouds, with warmer colours on the lighted side.
- Anne started with a harder pastel in a warmer colour so there is something underneath for the overlays to blend into, but left the paper to show through where the clouds are darker.
- Anne chose a range of intense colours, around the colour wheel, to work up from the cloud base to the top: blue-violet, violet, red-violet, peach (not red) yellow-orange, yellow.



- Warm yellow was the colour for the highlight at the top of the cloud, and needed more outline than the other soft-edged parts of the clouds.
- Anne used a Mount Vision gold pastel to glaze over the areas between the highlights and the body of the clouds.

How do you paint the trees and water?

- The distant trees were painted in purples but this was too vibrant. With a warmer colour glazed over, the trees settled into the distance, and vertical strokes lifted them to tie them to the cloud base.
- The foreground was a more vibrant green.
- If there is no wind, there will be reflections of the trees in the water. A breeze will break up the pattern. In this case, the major reflection is the clouds above, so the sides of the cloud shape should be vertically in line with the reflection.
- Use a darker blue for the reflection of the sky colour, then lighten it later to bring some of the sky and cloud colours down into the water.

At this point Anne made some decisions about what parts of the clouds to emphasise, where to break up the angles and shapes to make them more interesting, and where to add more tonal variation by greying some areas.

So much to learn from an inspirational set of exercises! Thanks, Anne.

Sunshine Coast Demonstration Report April 2018

At the Sunshine Coast April meeting, Anne Yang repeated her cloud demonstration, this time depicting a magnificent cloudy sky over her own local Lake Macdonald. Her focus was on the use of colour rather than tone. While advocating there is a place for both, she argued that the mood being sought can dictate the emphasis of one over the other. She proceeded to contrast warmer colours in the lights and cooler colours in the shadows, balancing hard and soft edges and reflected lights to create the mood she sought.

Tricia Taylor Demonstration - Rocky Coastlines with Watercolour Underpainting

Tricia chose a photograph of a wave breaking over rocks as her reference image.



Initial ideas Tricia's initial thoughts were – What is the story here? Why do I want to paint it? The more 'whys ' you ask yourself, the easier will be the 'hows' in the next stages of the painting.

While there was one main photograph, Tricia had taken another 5 or 6 photos to provide imagery for changing the composition and fitting new features into the composition if required.

Composition Thumbnail sketches were then used to explore and develop the composition. The large rock on the right hand side of the photo was considered an interesting feature, but too dominant. Its size needed to be reduced and its dark tone lightened. A key feature was the V-shape formed along the crest of the breaking wave. An area on the left of the developing composition required some further interest and Tricia decided to extend the unbroken part of the wave, relying on her experience with seascapes to invent this area rather than using reference material. Fibonacci principles were used to add other foreground shapes to the composition. The entry point for the eye was on the left of the composition and the rocks in the foreground were placed to provide a cup to contain the eye within the composition.

Paper colourIn deciding on the colour of thepaper, Tricia suggested that the photo reference beplaced on a number of different colours to see which

one 'popped'. Tricia subsequently chose a pale grey Colorfix paper for her painting.


Watercolour Underpainting Willow charcoal was used to create outlines of the main features and tones were added to flesh out the composition using watercolour. This medium leaves the greatest amount of tooth on the paper for later stages of pastel application. Three different tones were mixed and applied in large 'blocking' strokes, remembering that the watercolour will dry lighter than when it is wet.



Cheap paint brushes were used to apply the water colour to avoid damaging high quality watercolour brushes on the Colorfix surface. The temptation to overpaint at this stage is to be avoided. Only address form and tone.

The sea As pastel colour was added to the surface of the sea, Tricia chose 3 colours – one with a tone the same as the watercolour underpainting, one a tone lighter, and one a tone darker, and applied them in the order of dark tone, mid tone and then light tone in broken passages across the sea surface. The direction of application was in concert with the flow of the water and the three colours merged beautifully.





To define edges, use contrasting tones. To reduce edginess, use the midtone or similar tones.

The Rocks Avoid using black pastel in the dark shadow areas of the rocks. Create a black using dark green, dark blue and red (Unison 18, 15 and 2) to create a dark tone with colour nuances that will then marry with the lighter tones of these colours used in later development of the painting. Avoid painting details of the rock at this stage. The shape of the rock should have emerged after the 3 tones have been applied.

Cast shadows are sharper and form shadows are softer. Highlights are where the surface textures are found.

White water The temperature of the white water changes depending on what other colour is near it.

Tricia used a soft red violet in the white water and shuns using stark white in seascapes. Another favourite 'near white' colour is Unison light 12.

Warm pale lemon marks were added to the passages of white foam to create lines of movement and assist in leading the eye into the picture.

Stay as long as you can in the areas of darker tones before moving to areas of lighter tone.

Unbroken waves The murky olive colours in the base of the wave reflect the colours in the underlying beach sand. The colour change from the bottom of the wave to the top of the wave follows the sequence on the colour wheel.

The sky The light grey Colorfix was close to the desired sky colour. A pastel colour almost the same as the Colorfix was used to glaze the sky and soften the horizon line. Avoid drawing a pastel stick along the horizon line. Glazing up to the horizon line from above and below it will allow it to be defined, but not too defined.
